¹ 1 Administrators who find an ounce or less of marijuana on a student should presume that the student had the marijuana for their own consumption (see Type IV offense) and not for the purpose of selling.

^{*} Any offense that is not Type 6 must have "secondary findings" to allow for expulsion. Secondary findings are defined as 1) Other means of correction are not feasible or have repeatedly failed to bring about proper conduct or 2) Due to the nature of the act, the presence of the pupil causes a continuing danger to the physical safety of the pupil or others.
